

Those are welcoming words of Lent.

We are going to die. We are made up of dust and will eventually turn back into that dust.

But do not be sad. Do not be down. You are not without hope. You are not without the wonderful prospect of restoration in Christ.

Death can be such a sad thing. We as Christians can deal with it, but it is still hard. Without Christ, death is irreconcilable.

Christ turns death 'on its head.'

You see, death for a non-believer is the end of the party. It's the 'last call' of a great evening. It's when the ride is over and you have to get off. That stinks.

But for the believer, the believer has lived a different sort of life. The believer has not excessively partaken of those delights of the party. They have withheld, been moderate, and kept their passions in check.

That's why for the believer, death is the great release. Death for the believer is freedom from having to deal with the troubles of being sick. Death for the believer is freedom from the temptations they have been fighting against their entire lives. Death for the believer is getting off of work on a Friday night and having a 3-day weekend ahead of you...better yet...it's like getting off of work on a Friday of the last week of your work before you retire. That's a pretty good feeling.

Lent is time to step back and regain our focus. As Christians, as believers we are not supposed to live like non-believers. We have a different perspective on life and on death and it should be evident in how we live. If it is not, we need to take advantage of the graces of Lent to reorder things.

I hope your Lent is off to a good start, that you are praying more, fasting more, and giving more.
