

Hello everyone,

Two things today.

First I want to continue to remind and invite everyone to our weekly Friday Stations of the Cross prayer service and Lenten Fish Fry dinner. I once read a great Saint said that the quickest way to grow in holiness is to contemplate the passion of our Lord. Praying the Stations of the Cross is an excellent way to journey through our Lord's passion in prayer and contemplate the magnitude of God's sacrifice for us. It's sure to increase our love for God. And join us as well for our delicious fish dinner. We have a TOP-NOTCH team of volunteers who make it happen every week. They are super-cooks and superstars for God!

Second, I just want to say one thing about the Gospel reading today. Today we heard the amazing account of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. Lazarus was 'dead as a doornail,' as the saying goes, and Jesus prayed and brought him back to life. Jesus has got some kinda power!!!

Jesus did this to manifest his power over death. To show us that even in the face of taking our last breath, we do not have to fear so long as we seek shelter under the staff of our Good Shepherd. Jesus defeated death when He died and rose.

But I want to remind you of something I have said before (I don't remember where...the years are all starting to blend together...I am getting old), that Jesus does a greater miracle every time a person enters a confessional and confesses their sins and received Jesus' forgiveness.

That's right folks! Although you might be more impressed to see someone walk up to a dead person, say some words and then that dead person sit up, it is in fact more 'impressive' what God does each and every time someone walks into a confessional with a dump of sin and walks out like a newborn baby. The person's body who was dead and brought back to life is still going to die again...but the person who had their sins forgiven was given restoration to their soul, and the soul LIVES FOREVER. That's why when God forgives it is more 'impressive' or more significant to the Kingdom then when He heals.

On that note, please find attached to this bulletin an examination of conscience. Read over it. If you have committed these sins, confess them...be part of a miracle. If you haven't committed them, then take the sheet to your friend who has committed those sins and tell them to go to confession (that's a joke...sort of...).

God is still a miracle worker. We just have to understand what is actually a miracle.

Happy Lent!!! Only and couple more weeks. Make the most of it and take your spiritual life seriously! Your soul will thank you for it!!!!!!!!
