

Good day all.

I would like to start by saying a very grateful thank you to all the people who volunteered and worked so hard at our Barbeque Blast at St John last weekend. It was an excellent day: good fellowship, amazing food and perfect weather. God smiled upon us and gave us a wonderful day.

I love the Fall. I love the cooler air. It's great for running and leaving your windows open at night.

I was discussing this with my mother a week ago, and she said she loves it as well but it also makes her sad because she says it means that another year has passed.

I am not as old as her and I don't know what I will feel like when I am her age (she'd beat me if I said her age). I am sort of in between as to whether I mind if the years pass swiftly or slowly.

It's funny how when you are young you cannot wait to get old; old enough to drive, old enough to buy beer (legally), old enough to 'do what you want.'

And then we get a little older and we are not so sure it's that great to get old: driving isn't that fun, beer gives us a beer belly, and usually when we have the 'do what we want' feeling it leads to mistakes and sins.

But there are two excellent things to be excited about when getting old. And these ones are legit (that means 'real'... that's the way to young hipsters say it).

The first is that you get smarter. You get wiser.

I am convinced there is no substitute for age when it comes to wisdom. There is just some things (most things) you cannot learn in a book. You have to experience it. You have to go through it. And until you do, you just don't know what the heck you are talking about (most young people). In fact, I would say almost all the virtues increase with age; you become more prudent, more temperate, for selfcontrolled, more thoughtful in what you say and do.

Forget the world. The world has this one way wrong. They think it's great to be young, when you're immature and stupid. And they throw out and disrespect older people, thinking they don't offer anything anymore. In fact, it is at that time older folks offer the best we as humans have available to us, because at that point they have seen the most and their advice is the best and most accurate.

Secondly, the second good thing about getting old, and very simply put, the older you are the closer you are to heaven. It is very simple. Heaven is our destination. Heaven is where perfect and eternal joy is experienced. Life is a battle. Heaven is eternal happiness.

It takes faith to be able to say this, to say 'I can't wait to get to heaven.' And even more than that, it takes even more faith to be able to live with that same attitude as we battle through all that life throws at us. It takes a lot of faith to be able to look to the joys offered to us ahead in Heaven rather long for the past, especially in the midst of affliction or sickness or pain.

But we have to look forward and know what awaits ahead. A Christian always looks forward. Not back. A Christian's joy and hope is never in some longing for a return to their youth, but for a rebirth to another life...to be born again.
