

Just a reminder to all that this Thursday, November 1st is a Holy Day of Obligation, the Mass of all Saints. That means as a Catholic you have to go to Mass. Although it is ridiculous to think about going to Mass as an obligation. It's like saying you have to go pickup you billion dollars that you won in the lottery. It is hardly an obligation. It is a privilege and in fact the absolute greatest privilege of your life!
