Pastor message

In a few weeks you will be receiving in the mail the Bishop's annual appeal. In a few weeks we will show a video at Mass to show you what the money will be used for. I wanted to give you a heads up with this message and am asking you to be generous.

Your donations to the Bishop's annual appeal allows them to go to seminary and pray and discern without having to accrue a ton of debt. When our priests get old, they deserve to have health care and a reasonable place to live. Many of them end up at the Little Sisters of the Poor or at one of the nursing homes in our diocese. Some of our local pastors here in Richmond are running large parishes and are well into their 70's!!! Don't you think they should be taken care of when they finally decide to step down. Finally, it should be noted that a good portion of the gifts made to the Bishop's annual appeal are given right back to us here at our parish. And we stretch those dollars.
