



Pastor message

Today we hear about the three wise men discovering Christ in the manger. You could say, they had an 'epiphany.' They had an experience that changed their lives forever. They had always sought wisdom and knowledge and now they found and were profoundly moved by an infant lying in a manger. Obviously this was not any infant, but they recognized Him for who He was, the Savior of the World.

We hear that after paying homage and giving gifts they went back to their own countries.

We do not know much about what happened with them after that. Did they go back to life as usual when they got back home? Did the stresses of being 'wise men' come slamming back in their face the moment they

walked back in the door? Did they quickly go back to bad habits they swore they would quit after having such an amazing encounter with the Son of God? Did they stop doing good resolutions they intended to faithfully practice subsequent to meeting Him?

We do not know. There are some accounts that these faithful men remained faithful, even to the point of martyrdom for their faith. But we do not know for sure.

I will say that - like everyone else who has had a religious experience, an 'epiphany,' or some type of special event that really gave them a new and better perspective - they were certainly tempted to waste and squander the gift of that experience by falling back into 'things as usual.'

Have you had a religious experience? Have you had a life-changing or life-shifting event in your life? Sometimes it happens in prayer or at Mass or during a sacrament, sometimes it happens in conjunction with a sickness or the death of someone we love. How did it change you? And more importantly, are you still living as if the event occurred? Or have you fallen back into your old self, things as usual, and therein wasted the gift of that extra perspective you were given.

Don't waste your epiphanies.
