Pastor Message-

Pope Francis recently told a group of American Bishops who were visiting him in Rome that abortion is a “preeminent priority” that needs the utmost attention. The American Bishops also noted that during the visit the Pope was surprised to learn that over 60 million abortions have occurred in the United States since the 1973 Roe vs Wade decision legalized abortion. This week hundreds of thousands went to Washington DC to tell lawmakers to protect life and stop the brutal killing of babies in the womb. This is the annual March for Life.

How wicked the scourge of abortion is on our country! It is by far the greatest evil in the world today. People scream and shout and are offended about everything today, most of which is extremely trivial. But very few are offended by the disgusting slaughter of innocent babies, which in nearly all cases is done for convenience sake. It is the killing of life for convenience.

If you are Catholic, you have to be pro-life. It is not a debatable issue. The protection of innocent life from natural conception to natural death is a fundamental truth of Christianity. If you do not advocate the protection of the unborn you directly contradict the teachings of Jesus Christ. Christ would never, in any circumstance, ever allow someone to kill an innocent child. No one ever has a ‘right’ to kill a baby. Pray, pray, pray that this wicked and evil sin will end. When will people accept what the scientific community has been telling us for years: that life begins at conception!

E-GIVING

Myth: Only young parishioners would use online giving. The Catholic Church is rooted in a rich and long-standing history. But that doesn't mean that as times and trends change your online giving efforts shouldn't evolve. This Catholic giving myth is false. Over time, online banking and online shopping have become more accepted by all age groups, so has online giving. Now, online giving is widely used by parishioners of all ages.

Donors who would be classified as Baby Boomers (ages 55-75) spend 10% more time online each week than Millennials (ages 22-37). Baby Boomers widely use social media, with 82% of them regularly using at least one social media network. While donors belonging to Generation X (ages 38-54), prefer mobile and online banking to more traditional payment methods like checks.
