You do not need to have a facebook account. If they ask you to signup you can just ignore it. Just go to the link. If you go to the link before we begin the livestream you will have to refresh the webpage to get the livestream. The livestream begins 15 minutes before Mass time, so if you click the link about 10 minutes before the Mass time it should work well for you. If you are older and not sure how such things work, get your kid or grandkid to help you!

The services times are as follows:

Holy Thursday 7pm (livestream begins 645pm)

Good Friday 3pm (livestream begins 245pm)

Holy Saturday 8pm (livestream begins 745pm)

Easter Sunday 10am (livestream begins 945am)

I must confess I have never livestreamed a Mass before. So, forgive us if the camera falls over or we make other mistakes...all this is new!

We will also post a recording of each service so you can watch later, although it is better to watch during the livestream as you can do things like post comments during the service (it is sort of like talking during Mass...but permitted in this case).

All joking aside, we priests, clergy and staff are all doing well at the parishes. There is still plenty to keep our attention. Remember, our three Churches are open 9am-12noon on Sunday and a priest is available for confession and St Peter is open during the week 11am-1pm.

We are still visiting the sick and dying and communicating with parishioners and helping with needs that arise (PLEASE LET US KNOW IF YOU NEED ANYTHING, SPIRITUAL OR MATERIAL, WE ARE HERE FOR YOU).

Also, our outreach to the poor has been extra busy lately. We have had an increase in folks coming for meals during our lunch and dinner program and our volunteer count is understandably down. But not to worry, Fr Rossi has been rolling up his sleeves and burning dinner regularly (that is a joke...although I am truly a terrible cook).
