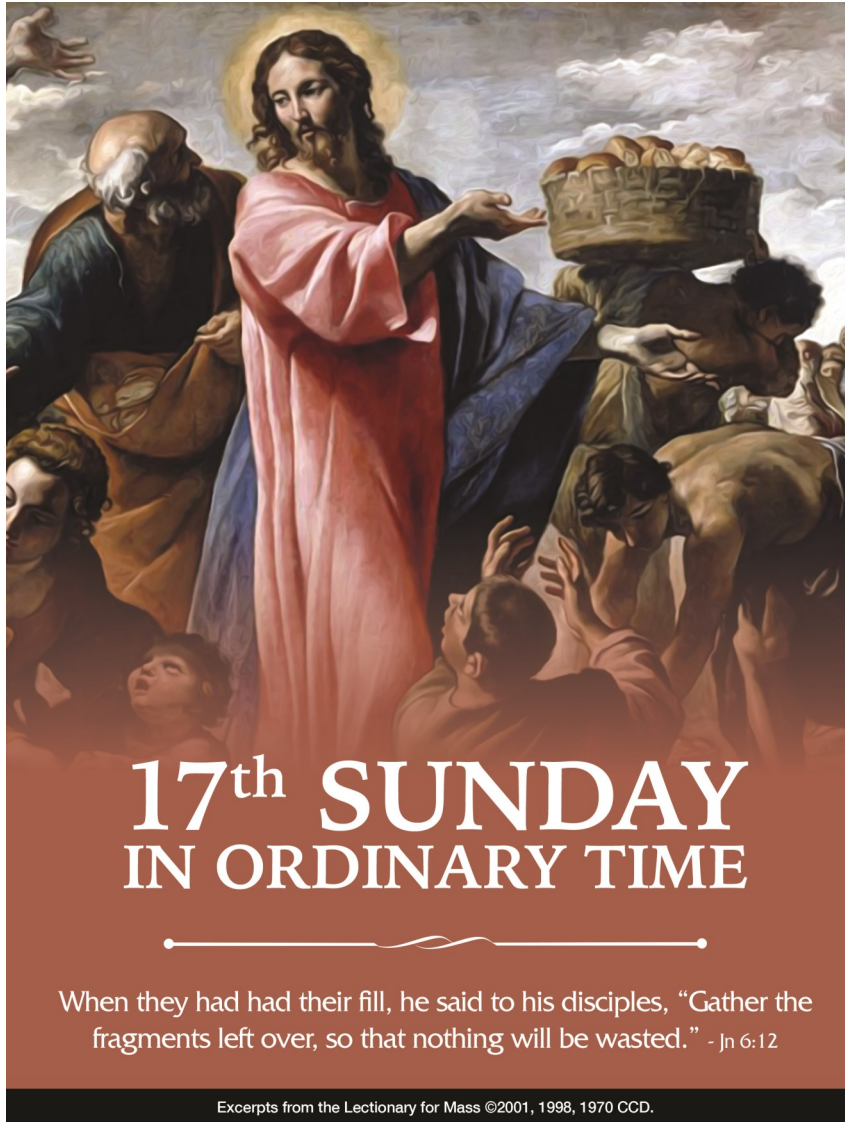

A Short Reflection on the day's readings

The multiplication of twenty barley loaves by the prophet Elisha to feed hundred people in the first reading, pre-figured the multiplication of five barley loaves by Jesus in the gospel to feed five thousand people to satisfy their hunger and provide what they needed. Both miracles foreshadowed the Holy Eucharist as spiritual food of eternal life for the soul, where the assembly of God's people as one body unite as one in the body of Christ, the church. In such a reunion is manifested:

The omnipotence and ability of God to do all things by providing the needs of the poor and needy

The unity of all people as one no matter the race, language and color

The provision of immortal food (the Holy communion) for our spiritual journey

The building up of Christ body, the church of sinners, as a holy people.

Thus, St. Paul admonishes the Ephesians and all of us in the second reading to live lives in a manner worthy of our call with gentleness, humility, patience, bearing with one another in peace and remaining in the bond of unity since we have all received one baptism, one faith and have one God as Father. This is a great miracle of God, that though there are differences in race, language, country, culture and color, yet we are all one people with a common goal.
