

The Parochial Vicar's Point of View— (PV)²

BAM! Imagine I punched my imaginary brother (not my real brother, of course!) in the nose. Now in this scenario, let's just say he did not deserve it... I did it out of malice. What are the effects of this malicious act? Well, for one, he has a broken nose. Two, he is now very mad at me (so are my parents!). It has affected me too. I am now a bit meaner, a bit more cold-hearted. I also remember the little bit of pleasure I got from punching this imaginary brother in the nose. These are some of the effects that come about by my left-handed upper-cut to my brother's imaginary nose. But there is also the effect on my soul. We hear that the "wages of sin is death." This means that my serious sin has deadly effect on my eternal soul—unrepentant, I am in danger of going to hell.

What I have described above is the double-effect of sin: the effects of sin in time and space (aka the temporal effects of sin—the broken nose, the hurt relationships, the memory of it, etc.) and the effects of

sin in eternity (which is eternal death).

And so what do I do? Well, of course I need to go to confession. And confession wipes clean the eternal effects of sin. I am no longer going to hell... thank God! However, what about those temporal effects... do they just disappear by going to confession? Of course not! My brother still has the broken nose, relationships are still hurt, I still have that memory of the punch. Those temporal effects in time and space need to be healed.

While we are still alive, there are various things that we can do to help heal those temporal effects of our sins. In addition to the necessary heartfelt apologies and acts of reparation, reception of the sacraments, acts of charity, the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy, our devotions, uniting our sufferings with Christ's, and various other things can help to lessen these effects of our sins in time and space. It is great that we can do these things while still alive. But what happens when we die and those temporal ef-

fects still are lingering?

Well, this is why we pray for the dead. We pray that Christ's sacrifice on the cross might bring purification to those who have died in His grace but still need further cleansing from those temporal effects of sin. This is what purgatory is—the process of Christ purifying those who have died in grace so that they might enter into the absolute perfection of heaven. The Church gives guidance on the types of prayers that might benefit the dead—and this includes offering Masses and gaining indulgences for those souls in purgatory. November, the month of the dead, is a perfect time to rededicate ourselves to praying for our deceased loved ones.

A Plenary Indulgence for the Holy Souls

A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted to the faithful who, on any and each day from November 1 to 8, devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the departed; on All Souls' Day (or, according to the judgment of the ordinary, on the Sunday preceding or following it, or on the solemnity of All Saints), devoutly visit a church or an oratory and recite an Our Father and the Creed.

A *partial indulgence*, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted to the faithful who, devoutly visit a cemetery and at least mentally pray for the dead;

devoutly recite lauds or vespers from the Office of the Dead or the prayer *Requiem aeternam* (Eternal rest). The faithful should be free of grave sin at the time of the visit, recite the requisite prayers, including praying for the Holy Father's intentions, receive Holy Communion and go to confession, with the intention of receiving the indulgence for the holy soul, within 20 days, before or after, All Souls Day. As an example: one may go to Church on the weekend of the 31st, go to confession and receive holy communion with the intention of gaining the indulgence for a holy soul and then pray the requisite prayers in a church.
