From the Desk of the Administrator

After the wandering of the people of Israel in the desert for forty years, they finally arrived at Gilgal in the Jericho plain peacefully, and the reproach of Egypt was removed from them. No more were they to depend on manna and the poor products of the desert, but on agriculture and sheep rearing. This accounts to the celebration of a great feast of Passover: eating cakes and parched grain as recounted in the first reading of today.

The History of the Israelites being led out of the land of slavery is an image of Christians also being led out of the state of sin which has enslaved them, to become children of God. Just as the Israelites made a great feast to celebrate their liberation, so do Christians celebrate their salvation in the participation of the Holy Eucharist, the Easter of Christ, his death and resurrection.

This shows why the **theme of reconciliation**, an invitation by St Paul in the second reading, becomes so important in this Lenten season, and the parable of the prodigal son who went wayward in today's gospel, found comfort and peace again in the *loving embrace of his father*.

God indeed has reconciled us to Himself through Christ and has given the ministry of reconciliation to the church whenever we go wayward from Him. What it means is that God always guides us to reconciliation with Him through His gratuitous and unlimited love to Himself and to other members of the community through the Sacrament of Penance.

a) How are we using the avenue of the Sacrament of Reconciliation or Penance to reconcile with God in this Lenten season after offending Him and our neighbor?

b) Are we seeing the repenting action of the prodigal son in the gospel as a means to promoting peace in the society, or the uncompromising action of his elder brother to work against peace?

May we continue to have a fruitful and meaningful Lenten observance.
