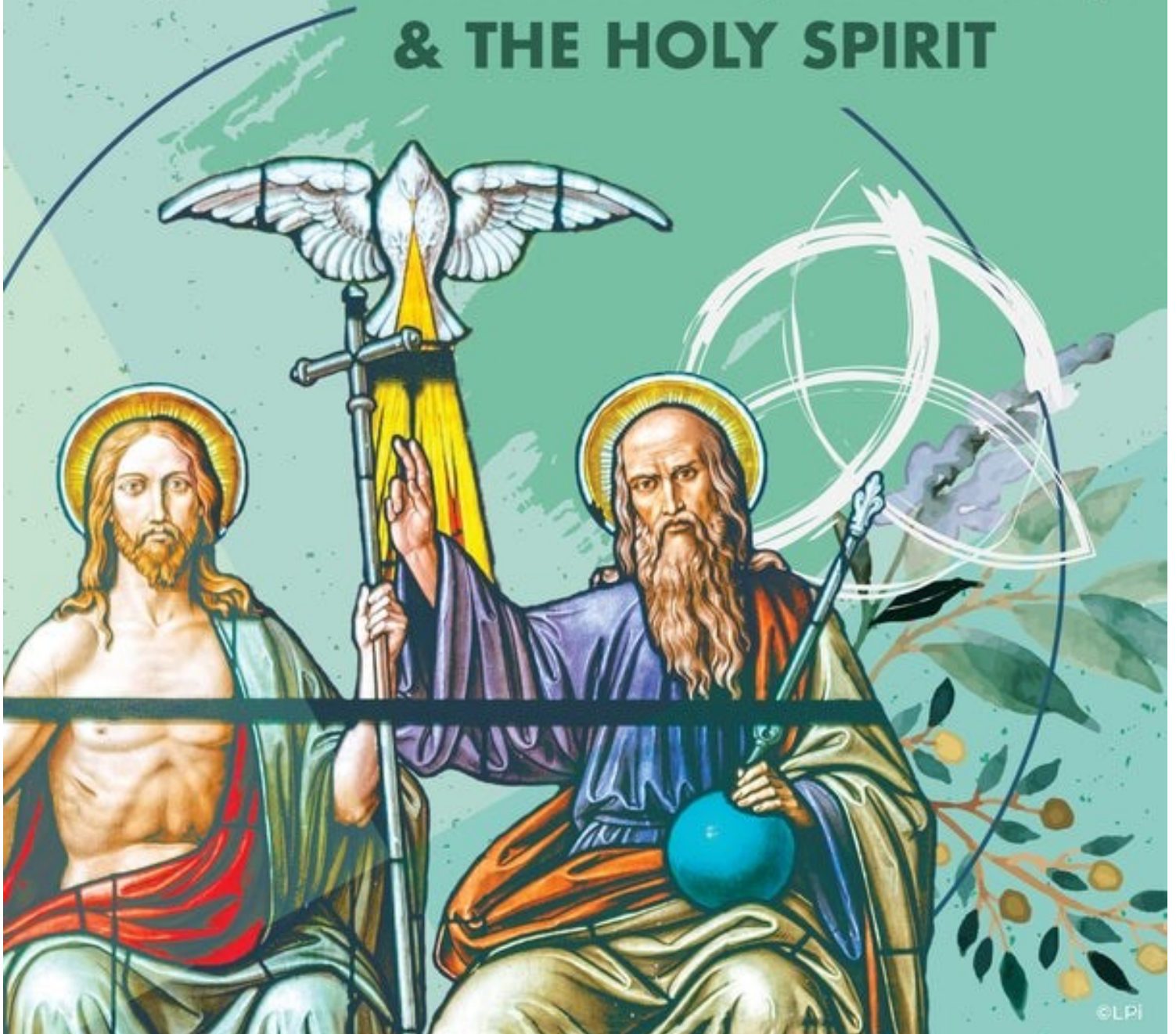

From Fr. Maxwell's office

For the Philosopher Spinoza, the absence of war in a given place does not always mean that there is peace. This is typical of the recent happenings of mass shootings in some states in the U.S a couple of days ago, and in the Catholic Church in Nigeria this past weekend.

The emergence of violence anywhere in the world according to Gandhi, is to "reverse the course of evolution and go against humanity's deepest nature, which is to love, to endure and to forgive, since nonviolence is a rule of conduct to be practiced for the good of the society and for peace to be prevailed." This is why the recent incidents of mass shooting (about 246 this year according to the Gun Violence Group Archive) across the U.S. leaving dozens killed or wounded; as well as the mass shooting of worshippers during this past weekend Pentecost Mass by attackers in Nigeria, killing dozens of people and leaving several injured in the church, have to be condemned.

When lives of individuals are grounded in the values of nonviolence, it will gradually widen to embrace the community, society and the world at large. The direction in which the world is moving nowadays is towards *individualism* and *violence*. The church needs to pray more since it is against violence and is always for life. These incidents are unfortunate because one does not go to the mall or supermarket or school graduation or church to meet his or her untimely death. Our hearts go with the family of these victims.

May the Lord heal those wounded and receive the souls of those who have lost their lives.
