## From the Desk of the Pastor

Dear people of God,

After a wonderful family reunion of Thanksgiving, in a few days, the church celebrates the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This is a doctrine of the belief that Mary the mother of Jesus was graced by God in such a way that she was preserved from the stain of sin from the first moment of her existence. Immaculate refers to the absence of sin due to the fact that she was preserved from original sin, and Conception refers to Mary's very beginning of life as a human person in her mother's womb. It therefore points to God's graciousness to her as she came into the world full of grace. Belief in Mary's original sinlessness celebrates God's victory over the powers of sin as this woman comes into the world. It is fitting that she should receive God's free abundant grace because of her role as the faith-filled mother of Jesus who is God, and it symbolizes the good news that in the life of every human being, grace is more original than sin. The biblical texts implicitly supporting the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception are: a) the angel Gabriel's greeting to Mary at the annunciation as "full of grace" already (Lk. 1:28); ii) Elizabeth's tribute to Mary as "blessed are you among women" (Lk. 1:42) and iii) the promise after the Fall of Adam and Eve that serpent's head would be crushed (Gen. 3:15)

Thus, the renowned biblical scholar R.E. Brown states that by the Immaculate Conception, "Mary receives a primacy in a privilege that all disciples of Jesus receive. In Christian faith we are delivered through baptism from original sin. We Roman Catholics believe that Mary was conceived free of original sin – a preparation by God for the sinlessness of Jesus who would take flesh in her womb....the immaculate conception says by anticipation the grace of Christ's redemption was given first to Mary as the first Christian disciple even from the time of her conception, since she is the only human person in history of salvation who has been immaculately conceived."

Pope Pius IX therefore declared: "the dogma that holds that the most Blessed Virgin Mary, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege from Almighty God and in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, was kept free of every stain of original sin." The three things noted in this definition are: the nature of Mary's privilege, the ground of the privilege and the mode of preservation.

Mary's holiness as deduced from this privilege should encourage us to seek her help and protection in our continual effort to overcome sin and sanctify our lives by responding positively to the promptings of the Holy Spirit so as to live as our baptism requires, and to entrust our striving for holiness to the all-holy Virgin.

Since it is a holyday of obligation, kindly attend mass to receive maternal blessings from the Blessed Mother as she intercedes for us.

On the 25th of December we will celebrate once more the moment when God was born into our world as the infant Jesus. December is also a month in which we celebrate the unique role that our Blessed Virgin Mary played in the life of Jesus, and continues to play in the lives of all the followers of Jesus. Whether we call her Queen, Empress, Patroness, or simply Mother, we are reminded of the personal love she has for each of us, and of the love each of us should have for her.
