

On the same day the year 2022 came to an end, the church received the sad news of the passing away of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI at the age of 95, who had retired for almost ten years now.

The church has lost such a fantastic a priest, university professor, a cardinal and an outstanding theological expert, an effective teacher and defender of the basics of the catholic faith using every medium at his disposal to catechize the faithful on foundational beliefs and practices of Christianity, when he later became the chief shepherd (the Roman Pontiff) of the Universal church of many Catholics worldwide.
