### SUNDAY REFLECTION

### SITUATION IN THE HOLY LAND

The general situation in Gaza continues to be very dire with no end in sight. A few facts: 1.9 million people are internally displaced; 2.2 million people at risk of famine, 24,000 people killed, 70% are women and children. Only 15 hospitals out of 36 are partially functioning; 69% of the schools have been destroyed; zero electricity or clean water; and only 11-200 humanitarian aid trucks delivered (except for north Gaza) compared to 600 trucks daily before the war. There are 600 people taking refuge at the Holy Family Church complex who are completely dependent on outside aid for food, water, medicines, clothing, and all their daily needs.

### SERVANT OF GOD, FRANK PARATER

As the Chancellor for the Diocese of Richmond, one of the tasks in which I have been asked to support the diocese is the promotion of the cause of the Servant of God, Frank Parater. One of my close mentors, Fr. Scott Duarte, JCD, pastor of our sister parish, Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton, Quinton, has been the Postulator for over 20 years. Over the last several months, I have been working with various individuals and companies to attempt to “promote” Frank Parater’s cause for canonization. At present, we are at the final stages of the “Diocesan Phase” and are anticipating the transition to the “Roman Phase,” to open the door to having Frank Parater, a seminarian of the Diocese of Richmond who died in Rome as a first-year seminarian and grew up at Saint Patrick, declared a “Blessed” in the Catholic Church.

I would like to commission one of my trusted contacts to create a statue of Frank for the Parish. Presently, there is a bronze statue of Frank in his Benedictine uniform in the Narthex of the new gym at Benedictine Preparatory, Frank is a graduate of Benedictine from its days on the campus of Saint Benedict, Richmond. My initial idea is to create a plaster statue of the “young” Frank Parater dressed as an altar server to serve as a pious reminder of the call to sanctity among the young faithful of the parish and the diocese (see image on the front of the bulletin). Eventually, I would love to see Frank’s body returned to his home parish where he was baptized (He is currently entombed in the mausoleum that belongs to the Pontifical North American College where he was a student from the fall of 1919 until his death of rheumatic fever on 7 February 1920). This might eventually lead to the creation of the National Shrine of Saint Frank Parater, perhaps, patron of diocesan seminarians and youth. Would you consider supporting this effort, do you have other ideas? **190th Anniversary** Our parish anniversary is Saturday, May 25th. While we have two weddings in the cluster that day, and one the day before, I would like to suggest that we offer Solemn Lauds in the morning, at 9:00 AM followed by a simple reception in the hall. Additionally, in honor of the anniversary we have been able to restore a chalice and paten set used at daily Mass; the Paschal Candle stand; a cruet set (being restored now); and the oil painting of Bishop Van de Vyver hanging in the meeting room off the narthex (currently being restored). These costs have been graciously covered by the Office of Archives through a grant. The Archivist and I are also working on Presentation Boards that would chart the history of the parish for a general display that would be visible in the narthex of the Church. Thoughts, comments? #### **Situación en Tierra Santa**

La situación general en Gaza sigue siendo muy grave y no se vislumbra un final. Algunos datos: 1,9 millones de personas están desplazadas internamente; 2,2 millones de personas en riesgo de hambruna, 24.000 personas asesinadas, el 70% son mujeres y niños. Sólo 15 de 36 hospitales funcionan parcialmente; El 69% de las escuelas han sido destruidas; cero electricidad o agua potable; y sólo se entregaron entre 11 y 200 camiones de ayuda humanitaria (excepto en el norte de Gaza), en comparación con los 600 camiones diarios antes de la guerra.

Hay 600 personas refugiadas en el complejo de la Iglesia de la Sagrada Familia que dependen completamente de la ayuda exterior para obtener alimentos, agua, medicinas, ropa y todas sus necesidades diarias.

Como Canciller de la Diócesis de Richmond, una de las tareas en las que se me ha pedido que apoye a la diócesis es la promoción de la causa del Siervo de Dios, Frank Parater. Uno de mis mentores más cercanos, el P. Scott Duarte, JCD, párroco de nuestra parroquia hermana, Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton, Quinton, ha sido el Postulador durante más de 20 años. Durante los últimos meses, he estado trabajando con varias personas y empresas para intentar “promover” la causa de canonización de Frank Parater. Actualmente, estamos en las etapas finales de la “Fase Diocesana” y estamos anticipando la transición a la “Fase Romana” para abrir la puerta a tener a Frank Parater, un seminarista de la Diócesis de Richmond que murió en Roma como primer ministro.
