# **2024 Holy Week Schedule** Sunday, March 24<sup>th</sup>

Commemoration of the Lord's entrance into Jerusalem, in anticipation of His Sacred Passion

# Monday, March 25<sup>th</sup>

#### 6:00 PM Chrism Mass, Cathedral of the Sacred Heart

This is the annual Mass where the priests renew their promises and the Bishop blesses and consecrates the holy oils (Oil of the Infirm [Anointing of the Sick], Oil of the Catechumens [for those to be baptized], Sacred Chrism [for Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders].

# Holy Thursday, March 28th

Mass of the Lord's Supper/ Misa de la Cena del Señor

This is the Mass commemorating the institution of the Most Holy Eucharist and the institution of the Sacred Priesthood, the Mandatum (Washing of the Feet) is traditionally offered following the homily.

# Good Friday, March 29th

Holy Communion is only brought to the faithful as Viaticum on this day, according to ancient tradition, Mass is **forbidden** on this day. Instead, there is a Liturgy of the Word, adoration of the Most Holy Cross and distribution of Holy Communion 12:00 PM – 3:00 PM **Confession** (Saint Peter)

# Holy Saturday, March 30th

The morning of Holy Saturday commemorates the period of the Lord's "descent into hell" as noted in the Apostle's Creed, it marks the death of the Lord and anticipates the resurrection. In the evening, we "vigil" in anticipation of the Resurrection and the Easter Sacraments. The evening Mass is marked by the Easter Fire, blessing of the Paschal Candle, extend Vigil readings, and the celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation.
