PASTOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION

Footprints on the floor

A few years ago, I had the opportunity to assist with a piligrimage to the Holy Land. One stop was to the traditional site of the Ascension of our Lord. In the chapel that marks the spot where the Lord rose to the clouds before the Apostles, there is a place marked in the marble by imprints that look like footprints. Tradition says that Our Lord left his mark on the ground in *that* place, leaving impressions of his feet. While it is *unlikely* that there was marble in *that location*, or that Our Lord left footprints behind, we can at least reflect on the significance that God has marked creation with His Presence. If that is the case, there is something beautiful in considering the reality that this world of ours has been *visited* physically by God Himself. He doesn't simply create and depart, leaving us to our own devices. He is an active participant in the "messiness" of our lives.

What would it take for you to "invite him in" this week? He loves you enough "to be invited" into the mess of your live, will you give Him permission?

CLUSTER NEWS

As I near the one-year mark in the parish, I mentioned to the Saint John community two weekends ago, at the 9:00 AM Mass, that I am interested in having a **broader conversation** about the **weekend schedule**. *Presently*, the schedule does not allow the priests time to spend with the various communities *between Masses*, inhibiting us from offering or attending formation for youth or adults when the communities naturally come together on the weekends. This is largely due to the need to move from *three* priests to *two* priests, after the *reduction* following the time that Fathers Rossi, Bulinda and Wiggins were present in the communities. There is a **need** to *consider* providing another **Sunday Mass** at Saint Patrick; *if this is considered*, *provided we can find an additional priest to assist with Masses*, we might be able to consider having 2 Masses each Sunday in each parish. For some of our retired priests, this would be a welcome addition, some are looking for opportunities to assist regularly on the weekends.

If this were considered as a viable option, what would you want your community to offer?

Presently, the following schedule has been suggested:

Saint Peter - remains the same - 8:30 (No Music), 10:45 AM (Music)

Saint Patrick - 8:00 AM (No Music), 10:30 AM (Music) (Formation before the 10:30, and Fellowship after)

Or an evening Mass. *Personally*, I am less than inclined to offer an evening Mass; there is one at the Cathedral and it is <u>not</u> well attended, outside of the academic year, due to the presence of campus ministry events in the evenings on Sundays.

Saint John - 8:00 AM (Music), 9:15 AM Formation, 10:45 AM Spanish Mass

If the schedule above were embraced, it would allow time for rehearsal the musicians at Saint Patrick, something that is lacking currently.

If we were able to secure an additional priest (costs would simply be weekend coverage for retired priests), we would be able to allow each priest to spend a Sunday in each parish, without worrying about travel and getting out from Mass quickly to cover other Masses and events. If this were opportune for us, then, we would set up a schedule to allow us to rotate between the parishes on a regular basis. This conversation is also occurring at the same time as a conversation regarding setting up a volunteer-based office at Saint Patrick during the week. Presently, we are considering staffing an office in the basement of the rectory with a committed group of volunteers who have already offered their time: 9:00 AM - 1:00 PM, Monday - Friday. In the coming weeks, we are planning on meeting to discuss duties (to include opening the Church during that time). The more we can open our churches to the faithful, and to the curious, passerby, the better; what is better than opening our beautiful churches for quiet prayer? HVAC, roof and other

Thank you for your patience and understanding as we negotiated contractors and options regarding our facilities. As you know, a generous benefactor contributed **ALL** of the funds to pay for the new HVAC system for the Church. In the next couple of weeks, we will finalize the contract, with a walkthrough of the changes. The present work is a bit different from what was originally agreed to in our initial planning, but without *major* changes to the cost. When all is "said-and-done," we will have some tweaks to the property (landscaping), some covers to the copper piping, and some education on the thermostats.

Additionally, we are preparing for a new roof on the Commons in the coming weeks; we are anticipating a walk-through of the work to be accomplished. When this project is complete we will follow-up with the replacement of the ceiling tiles throughout the additions that were added on to the Church. - Fr. Capuano
