PASTOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION

The Feast of Corpus Christi - Reception of Holy Communion

As we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi that places a special emphasis on the Eucharist, it is a good reminder for us to note *what* we are doing when we approach the Lord. Among any number of areas we could reflect upon, maybe I can mention just a couple, regarding *reverence*:

When we receive Our Lord, we recognize that it is a kind of "refuge for sinners" and medicine for the weak, but it presupposes that we are in a state of grace, free of mortal sin, to benefit from the graces that this union with Our Lord offers. Being in a state of grace is not *subjective*. Your *objective* choices determine whether you are prepared adequately to receive the Eucharist. We cannot rationalize sin away, come to confession, prepare to receive the Lord freely.

How do you receive, on the tongue, in the hand? It is your choice, though the universal norm is to receive kneeling on the tongue, and the US norm is standing. When you present yourself for Communion, don't forget to make a profound bow (with the waist), if not kneeling, and present *your tongue, or one hand*. Sometimes, we get very creative presentations of hands and tongues, please be mindful that we need to know if you are receiving. If you come in the line with hands crossed before your chest, we assume you want a blessing; if you present two open-faced palms, you are not helping me determine where to place the host. What should we be aiming at: an open and extended tongue, a *flat* hand, with one underneath. Let's strive for devotion and focus as we approach our Lord in Holy Communion. Why am I suggesting all this? It is due to the reality that *the Lord* is present in the sacrament, and we owe Him due honor. Please be assured of my prayers this week. - Fr. Capuano

MUSIC AT SAINT PATRICK & SAINT JOHN

In contrast to times of the year when the church calls for more reserved musical embellishment (ex. the use of the organ to accompany voices only during Advent and Lent, and not to be played solo), the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Our Lord, Corpus Christi [literally, the Body of Christ], calls for a full flourishing of the musical tradition that the history of the Church has to offer. Not the least of which is exemplified in the twenty-four verse sequence hymn for this Sunday! "The most solemn musical expressions (i.e. this long sequence) retain their primary responsibility of engaging human hearts in the mystery of Christ that is being celebrated on a particular occasion by the Church." (Sing to the Lord, USCCB, 2007)

San Juan

Una nota del Párroco - La Fiesta del Corpus Christi - Recepción de la Sagrada Comunión

Al celebrar la Fiesta que pone especial énfasis en la Eucaristía, es un buen recordatorio para nosotros tomar nota de lo que debemos hacer cuando nos acerquemos al Señor. Entre muchas áreas sobre las que podríamos reflexionar, tal vez pueda mencionar solo un par, con respecto a la reverencia:

Cuando recibimos a Nuestro Señor, reconocemos que es una especie de "refugio de los pecadores" y medicina para la débil, pero presupone que estemos en estado de gracia, libres de pecado mortal, para beneficiarnos de las gracias que esta unión con las ofertas de Nuestro Señor. Estar en estado de gracia no es subjetivo. Tus elecciones objetivas determinan si estás preparado adecuadamente para recibir la Eucaristía. No podemos racionalizar el pecado, confesarnos, prepararnos para recibir al Señor libremente.

¿Cómo se recibe, en la lengua, en la mano? Es su elección, aunque la norma universal es recibir arrodillado sobre la lengua, y la norma estadounidense es de pie. Cuando te presentes a comulgar, no olvides hacer una profunda reverencia (con la cintura), si no de rodillas, y presentar la lengua o una mano. A veces, recibimos presentaciones muy creativas de manos y lenguas; tenga en cuenta que necesitamos saber si las está recibiendo. Si vienes en la fila con las manos cruzadas ante el pecho, asumimos que quieres una bendición, si presentas las dos palmas abiertas, no me estás ayudando a determinar dónde colocar la hostia. Esforcémonos por tener devoción y concentración mientras nos acercamos a nuestro Señor en la Sagrada Comunión. Tengan la seguridad de mis oraciones esta semana. - P. Capuano
