PASTOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION

“In truth, I see that God shows no partiality.

Rather in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him.”

These words from Saint Peter can be, and often are, taken out of context to point where objective truth becomes meaningless. It leads to the pervasive *opinion* that all religions are the same, and, “as long as I’m good, I’ll be at peace in the life to come.” The thing is, it is Christian teaching that there is a “life to come.” Additionally, there is “one name, before all must bow.” For Saint Peter, all must fear *Him*, and act uprightly according to the pattern of the Gospel. Saint Peter knew the results of taking life under his own authority and trying to shape things according to his own perspective. He was called a deceiver, a satan, by Our Lord, he was rebuked later by Saint Paul for trying to appease the hard-line Jews, even though it had become clear that the old laws had been fulfilled in the Person of Christ.

In what ways is your life not in accord with the teaching of the Church? When was the last time you went to confession? If it has been a while, pick up an examination of conscience and take a risk and coming into contact with the Lord’s objective mercy. Don’t rely on the “I’m OK, I’m right with the Lord,” simply because you don’t want to face the reality of your own life. The Lord is ready and waiting to open you up for more.

Please be assured of my prayers this week. - Fr. Capuano

CLUSTER NEWS

As I near the one-year mark in the parish, I mentioned to the Saint John community last weekend, at the 9:00 AM Mass, that I am interested in having a **broader conversation** about the weekend schedule. *Presently*, the schedule does not allow the priests time to spend with the various communities *between Masses*, inhibiting us from offering or attending formation for youth or adults when the communities naturally come together on the weekends. This is largely due to the need to move from *three* priests to *two* priests, after the *reduction* following the time that Fathers Rossi, Bulinda and Wiggins were present in the communities. There is a **need** to *consider* providing another **Sunday Mass** at Saint Patrick; ***if this is considered, provided we can find an additional priest to assist with Masses***, we might be able to consider having 2 Masses each Sunday in each parish. For some of our retired priests, this would be a welcome addition, some are looking for opportunities to assist regularly on the weekends.

If this were considered as a viable option, what would you want your community to offer? Presently, the following schedule has been suggested:

Saint Peter - remains the same - 8:30 (No Music), 10:45 AM (Music)

Saint Patrick - **8:00 AM** (No Music), **10:30 AM** (Music) (Formation before the 10:30 and Fellowship after)

Or an evening Mass. ***Personally***, *I am less than inclined to offer an evening Mass; there is one at the Cathedral and it is not well attended, outside of the academic year, due to the presence of campus ministry events in the evenings on Sundays.*

Saint John - **8:00 AM** (Music), **9:15 AM** Formation, **10:45 AM** Spanish Mass

If the schedule above were embraced, it would allow time for rehearsal the musicians at Saint Patrick, something that is lacking currently.

If we were able to secure an additional priest (costs would simply be weekend coverage for retired priests), we would be able to allow each priest to spend a Sunday in each parish, without worrying about travel and getting out from Mass quickly to cover other Masses and events. ***If this were opportune for us, then***, we would set up a schedule to allow us to *rotate between the parishes* on a regular basis. This conversation is also occurring at the same time as a conversation regarding setting up a volunteer-based office at Saint Patrick during the week. Presently, we are considering staffing an office in the basement of the rectory with a committed group of volunteers who have already offered their time: 9:00 AM - 1:00 PM, Monday - Friday. In the coming weeks, we are planning on meeting to discuss duties (to include opening the Church during that time). The more we can open our churches to the faithful, and to the curious, passerby, the better; what is better than opening our beautiful churches for quiet prayer? **Just a start to the conversations, please email me with ideas:** bcapuano@richmondcluster.org - Fr. Más bien, en cada nación, el que le teme y actúa con rectitud le es acepto”.

Estas palabras de San Pedro pueden sacarse de contexto, y a menudo lo hacen, para señalar dónde la verdad objetiva pierde sentido. Conduce a la opinión generalizada de que todas las religiones son iguales y que “mientras sea bueno, estaré en paz en la vida venidera”. La cuestión es que la enseñanza cristiana es que hay una "vida por venir". Además, hay “un nombre, ante el cual todos deben inclinarse”. Para San Pedro, todos deben temerle y actuar con rectitud según el modelo del Evangelio. San Pedro conocía los resultados de tomar la vida bajo su propia autoridad y tratar de moldear las cosas según su propia perspectiva. Nuestro Señor lo llamó engañador, satanás, y más tarde San Pablo lo reprendió por tratar de apaciguar a los judíos de línea dura, a pesar de que había quedado claro que las antiguas leyes se habían cumplido en la Persona de Cristo.

¿De qué manera su vida no está de acuerdo con las enseñanzas de la Iglesia? ¿Cuándo fue la última vez que fuiste a confesarte? Si ha pasado un tiempo, haz un examen de conciencia y arriégate y entra en contacto con la misericordia objetiva del Señor. No confíes en el “Estoy bien, estoy bien con el Señor” simplemente porque no quieres enfrentar la realidad de tu propia vida. El Señor está listo y esperando para abrirte a más.
