#### THE PASTOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION

Since my mission preaching days after college, I find myself constantly struck by the text from the second reading: So let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help.

Do you notice that Catholics have a tendency to sit at the back of the room? Is it deference to the Holy of Holies, or is it an awareness of personal unworthiness? I would sit in the back, if I didn't have to sit at the front... I survive off my unworthiness, off of my own resources, it is not instinct for me to be confident about approaching the altar and *knowing* the Lord will respond to my pleas.

What about you?

Please be assured of my prayers this week.

#### FROM THE PASTOR

Pastoral Council: I'm very grateful to those who have responded thus far to the invitation to join the various pastoral councils for each of our parishes, a bit of a change from the last two years that saw a combined council for all three parishes. I appreciate your patience as I sift through the responses and attempt to set out for those who have volunteered various recommendations for meeting times that might fit our schedules. Additionally, I appreciate your patience and understanding as I juggle the various duties that often take me from the parishes on a regular basis. Please know that I will be reaching out soon to begin finding appropriate days and times when we might meet to reflect and serve our communities. I'm still open to others who might be interested in serving.

Además, agradezco su paciencia y comprensión mientras hago malabarismos con los diversos deberes que a menudo me alejan de las parroquias de manera regular. Tengan en cuenta que pronto me pondré en contacto con ustedes para comenzar a encontrar días y horarios apropiados en los que podamos reunirnos para reflexionar y servir a nuestras comunidades. Todavía estoy abierto a otras personas que puedan estar interesadas en servir.

#### **Sound System**

Last week I met with our sound engineers to begin conversations about updating the systems at Saint Patrick and Saint John.

At Saint Patrick: We will receive bids to update the front speakers, as well as the monitors in the back, the pulpit microphone and the other technology necessary to support the system. The system in the hall will remain the same.

At Saint John: We will receive bids with options to replace the speakers in the church, the sound board, a plan for moving the choir, updated microphones for the pulpit and choir and a cleaner, less cluttered arrangement for the newly placed choir, once we are prepared to move forward with the interior updates.

Various projects and endeavors around the community: We're continuing the statue restoration project at Saint Peter and looking for assistance in cleaning the marble and restoring the altar rail and fixing the baptismal font (along with its relocation to is early 1900s location in the nave of the Church, all with the blessing of the Bishop. At Saint Patrick, we're working on bids to restore the front doors of the Church, and in the midst of a design for a dedicated confessional and we're beginning to get bids to repair the exterior and interior doors of the Church (as well as finalizing the refurbishment of the apartment we purchased a little over a year ago. At Saint John, I received the first set of draft renderings of the scope of work for the interior renewal of the Church. Last week, I submitted recommendations for tweaking the design.

I hope to present photos of the statue repair progress, sketches for the confessional and interior of the Saint John sanctuary soon. In regard to new work in the Churches, outside of basic repairs, my intention is always to pray, consult with staff and with the parish(es) at-large, reflect, and pray some more, and then make a decision on how to proceed. I'm always available to share what I'm thinking and have no intention of trying to force an agenda. I'm not a fan of campaigns, I'm more of a "pay-as-you-go" kind of guy. I'm grateful for your generosity and commitment to our parishes. Let's keep praying and working for the Lord. - Fr. Capuano

# Music at Saint Patrick & Saint John

Active participation (participatio actuoso) is a main hallmark of the Second Vatican Council and the liturgical reforms that followed. What does it mean to be active at Mass? If we are to break it down, the term participatio actuoso implies what is happening internally and externally. Are we singing the words, speaking the responses, and listening? In other words, are we participating outwardly or externally? This is part of what the Church means by participation. It is a very important element in our effort to give God just worship and honor. However, if we sing without joyful praising God in our hearts (cf. Eph 5:19-21), speak without believing, or listen without really hearing, have we really given God our time, effort, and love? That would be external participation. Are we being brought to closer relationship with God through our worship of Him on Sunday? There are practical things we can do to enter into the Mass more fully, before Mass begins. First, I would suggest looking at the readings before attending Mass on Sunday. Maybe take ten minutes on Sunday morning and sit quietly with God or with your family to read through the readings and the Collect. The Collect, or the Opening Prayer, is a rich source of thematic poetry that ties the readings together and can help direct our thoughts toward what God wants to tell us that day. Second, sing the mass Ordinary at home! If you look up on Youtube the ICEL chant mass ordinary, there are many versions to listen to. Sing your favorite hymns at home. Singing is certainly an any-time activity and not just for Sunday morning!

- 2. **Send Volunteers**: Volunteer teams to help with setup and preparation on the day of the event, as well as during the dinner to serve the meals.
- 3. Monetary Donations: For those unable to contribute food or volunteers, individuals and Churches can send monetary donations to Chimborazo Elementary School. These funds will help ensure that all supplies and additional food needs are met.


