THE PASTOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION/ REFLEXIÓN SEMANAL DEL PASTOR

The Feast of the Holy Family is a reminder that each of us form, in various ways, a “domestic church” in the homes that we come from, and/ or homes that we intentionally form.

All of our relationships have a potential for us to develop arenas of grace for us to allow the Lord to sanctify us and help us to grow in our individual roles.

May the Holy Family intercede for us!

On the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God, January 1, the faithful can receive a plenary indulgence (the removal of all temporal punishment due to sin) for **oneself, or for one holy soul in purgatory**, by fulfilling the following conditions: be in the state of grace at the time of the work of piety, go to confession and receive the Most Holy Eucharist within 20 days on either side of doing the work of piety.

I invite you to join me in praying the *Veni Creator* on January 1 to obtain the indulgence:

Come, Holy Spirit, Creator blest,
and in our souls take up Thy rest;
come with Thy grace and heavenly aid
to fill the hearts which Thou hast made.

O comforter, to Thee we cry,
O heavenly gift of God Most High,
O fount of life and fire of love,
and sweet anointing from above.

Thou in Thy sevenfold gifts are known;
Thou, finger of God's hand we own;
Thou, promise of the Father, Thou
Who dost the tongue with power imbue.

Temporal Punishment is the “residual,” the consequence of sin that hangs on the soul, despite confessing one's sin, it's like the “chains of Jacob Marley” from Dicken's, *The Christmas Story*, it is the weight of the result of our sin, even though we confess and are forgiven. My wounding you hangs around, in this life we can be freed from that weight due to sin by our conversion, our penance, and the graces extended by Holy Mother Church, like through the reception of indulgences.

A *Partial* Indulgence is granted for oneself, or a holy soul in purgatory, when you are in a state of grace, but when you only fulfill part of the indulgenced work: maybe you offer the prayer, but skip either receiving the Eucharist with the intention of receiving the indulgence, or going to confession with the intention of receiving the indulgence.

On the last day of the year, December 31st, offer the *Te Deum* to receive the same partial or plenary indulgence. The text is provided on the insert.

En la Solemnidad de Santa María Madre de Dios, el 1 de enero, los fieles pueden recibir una indulgencia plenaria (La eliminación de todo castigo temporal debido al pecado.) para sí mismos, o para una sola alma santa del purgatorio, cumpliendo las siguientes condiciones: estar en estado de gracia en el momento de la obra de piedad, confesarse y recibir la Santísima Eucaristía dentro de los 20 días siguientes a la realización de la obra de piedad.

Los invito a unirse a mí en la oración del *Veni Creator* el 1 de enero para obtener la indulgencia:

Ven, Espíritu Santo, Creador bendito,
y descansa en nuestras almas;
ven con tu gracia y tu ayuda celestial
a llenar los corazones que has creado.

Oh consolador, a Ti clamamos,
Oh don celestial de Dios Altísimo,
Oh fuente de vida y fuego de amor,
y dulce unción de lo alto.

Tú en tus siete dones eres conocido;
Tú, dedo de la mano de Dios, somos reconocidos;
Tú, promesa del Padre, Tú
que das poder a la lengua.

El castigo temporal es el “residuo”, la consecuencia del pecado que pende sobre el alma, a pesar de confesar el pecado, es como las “cadenas de Jacob Marley” de La historia de Navidad de Dickens, es el peso del resultado de nuestro pecado, aunque lo confesemos y seamos perdonados. Mi herida te sigue rondando, en esta vida podemos ser liberados de ese peso debido al pecado por nuestra conversión, nuestra penitencia y las gracias extendidas por la Santa Madre Iglesia, como a través de la recepción de indulgencias.

Se concede indulgencia parcial para uno mismo o para un alma santa del purgatorio, cuando se está en estado de gracia, pero se cumple sólo una parte de la obra indulgente: tal vez se ofrece la oración, pero se omite recibir la Eucaristía con la intención de recibir la indulgencia, o ir a confesarse con la intención de recibir la indulgencia.

El último día del año, el 31 de diciembre, se ofrece el *Te Deum* para recibir la misma indulgencia parcial o plenaria. El texto se encuentra en el folleto.

TE DEUM ON THE LAST DAY OF THE YEAR

Te Deum, also sometimes called the Ambrosian Hymn because of its association with St. Ambrose, is a traditional hymn of joy and thanksgiving. First attributed to Sts. Ambrose, Augustine, or Hilary, it is now accredited to Nicetas, Bishop of Remesiana (4th century). It is used at the conclusion of the Office of the Readings for the Liturgy of the Hours on Sundays outside Lent, daily during the Octaves of Christmas and Easter, and on Solemnities and Feast Days. The petitions at the end were added at a later time and are optional. A partial indulgence is granted to the faithful who recite it in thanksgiving and a plenary indulgence is granted if the hymn is recited publicly on the last day of the year.

O God, we praise Thee, and acknowledge Thee to be the supreme Lord.

Everlasting Father, all the earth worships Thee.

All the Angels, the heavens and all angelic powers,

All the Cherubim and Seraphim, continuously cry to Thee:

Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of Hosts!

Heaven and earth are full of the Majesty of Thy glory.

The glorious choir of the Apostles,

The wonderful company of Prophets,

The white-robed army of Martyrs, praise Thee.

Holy Church throughout the world acknowledges Thee:

The Father of infinite Majesty;

Thy adorable, true and only Son;

Also the Holy Spirit, the Comforter.

O Christ, Thou art the King of glory!

Thou art the everlasting Son of the Father.

When Thou tookest it upon Thyself to deliver man,

Thou didst not disdain the Virgin's womb.

Having overcome the sting of death, Thou opened the Kingdom of Heaven to all believers.

Thou sittest at the right hand of God in the glory of the Father.

We believe that Thou wilt come to be our Judge.

We, therefore, beg Thee to help Thy servants whom

Thou hast redeemed with Thy Precious Blood.

Let them be numbered with Thy Saints in everlasting glory.

V. Save Thy people, O Lord, and bless Thy inheritance!

R. Govern them, and raise them up forever.

V. Every day we thank Thee.

R. And we praise Thy Name forever, yes, forever and ever.

V. O Lord, deign to keep us from sin this day.

R. Have mercy on us, O Lord, have mercy on us.

V. Let Thy mercy, O Lord, be upon us, for we have hoped in Thee.

R. O Lord, in Thee I have hoped; let me never be put to shame.

MUSIC AT SAINT PATRICK & SAINT JOHN

The celebration of Christmas is not just one day, but a whole octave! Traditionally, major feasts, such as Christmas and Easter, had eight full days of celebration, equal to the principal feast. In fact, the Marian antiphon we sing at the end of mass, Alma Redemptoris Mater, continues until the feast of the Presentation of Jesus at the Temple (Feb 2nd). The text provides a beautiful meditation for us during the season of Christmas:

O loving Mother of our Redeemer,
gate of heaven, star of the sea,
Hasten to aid thy fallen people
who strive to rise once more.

Thou who brought forth thy holy Creator,
all creation wond'ring,
Yet remainest ever Virgin,
taking from Gabriel's lips
that joyful "Hail!":
be merciful to us sinners.

May we continue to celebrate with joy and thankful hearts, the arrival of Our Lord, as we move toward the celebrations of Epiphany and Jesus' Baptism.

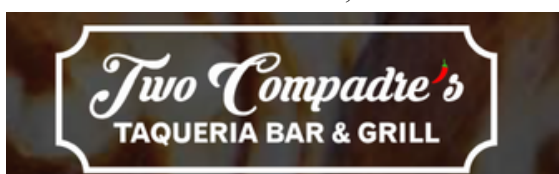
