Former parochial vicar of the Richmond parishes Fr. Danny Cogut, pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Salem, and former vicar here in our parishes provided a note to his parishioners this past week. We include it here, so that you might consider offering prayer and support - Fr. Capuano

### From Fr. Danny Cogut:

As many of you know, a couple weeks ago I was in the hospital for a couple days for anemia. It turns out that the reason for it was that they found cancer in my stomach, and possibly my liver. Obviously, this came as a great shock to me and my family-as I'm sure it does for you all.

I plan on getting treatment in Richmond, to be with my parents. There are still lots of unknowns about the prognosis and treatment options, but I've asked Bishop Knestout for a medical leave of absence starting Monday, December 16. He has graciously offered to appoint a temporary priest-administrator of OLPH for the duration of my treatment, which may take several months. We don't know who that will be yet (as of the time of this writing), but hopefully it will be announced soon. God willing, I'll be able to return after the treatment.

I know this will seem like deja vu for many of you, with the illnesses of our previous pastors (as it does for me and my family, with my sister). I'll be asking for the intercession of our dear Servant of God Frank Parater [www.frankparater.org] for healing, and I humbly ask you all to do the same. Frank was a Richmond seminarian, a graduate of Benedictine, and an Eagle Scout, who died in Rome from rheumatic fever at the age of 22. Perhaps we'll make him a saint!

### Music at Saint Patrick & Saint John

Vespers, Adoration, Masses on Solemnities and Feasts (outside of regular Sunday Mass; ex. Holy Day of Obligation [Immaculate Conception] Dec 9th and Our Lady of Guadalupe Dec 12th); all these forms of prayer are a part of the liturgical life of the parish. The liturgical life is the core of the Church's ministry, from which our evangelical spirit flows. How can we expect to be renewed in Christ and have life within us, if not through the Most Blessed Sacrament ("unless you eat my flesh and drink my blood, you shall have no life in you." John 6:53)? How can we expect to worship God rightly and unselfishly, if we don't look to how the Church has worshiped Him throughout the ages and continue the organic development of that prayer? The Catechism of the Catholic Church has a section devoted to prayer and I encourage you to read the whole chapter. In relation to vocal prayer, particularly the disposition of our hearts while praying, it says: "whether or not our prayer is heard depends not on the number of words, but on the fervor of our souls." In Sacrosanctum Concilium, the principal document of the Vatican II Council on the liturgy discusses the encouragement of praying the Liturgy of the Hours (or Divine Office) as a congregation: "the chief hours, especially Vespers, are [to be] celebrated in common in church on Sundays and the more solemn feasts...the laity, too, are encouraged to recite the divine office, either with the priests, or among themselves, or even individually." During Advent, please join us for Vespers on Wednesdays at St Patrick and for Adoration at each of the parishes in the cluster, most newly added at St. Patrick, Saturdays 9-10AM, as we prepare for the coming of Our Lord!
