Music at Saint Patrick and Saint John

Continuing in our discussion of the Order of Mass, the proceeding parts of the Mass are the Lord's Prayer, Sign of Peace, and the Fraction of the Bread. "Lamb of God," of course, is the musical text that is sung while the priest breaks the bread. This text is from Gospel of John 1:29—"Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world" and the fraction of the breads "signifies that the many Faithful are made one body by receiving Communion from the one Bread of Life (GIRM, 83). While the Second Vatican Council document on Sacred Music [Sacrosanctum Concilium] says that "a suitable place may be allotted to their mother tongue," the following paragraph says, concerning singing the Ordinary of the Mass in latin: "nevertheless steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them." As we strive to worship God in a manner pleasing to Him and conformed to the Tradition of Our Mother, the Church, may we enter into the Mass ever more deeply.

The Feast of Mercy

A Day of Extraordinary Grace for the Entire World

"I desire that the first Sunday after Easter be the Feast of Mercy." Jesus to St. Faustina

In a series of revelations to Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s, our Lord repeatedly called for the celebration of the Feast of Mercy on the first Sunday after Easter. He promised an ocean of graces to be poured upon the world. Today, we know this feast as Divine Mercy Sunday, named by St. John Paul II at the canonization of St. Faustina

"No soul that has called upon My mercy has ever been disappointed or brought to shame."

"Ordinarily, only the sacrament of Baptism effects in the soul the 'complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. Reception of the Eucharist in a state of grace ordinarily remits only venial sin, while strengthening the against both venial and mortal sin (Catechism, 1394-1395). But on Mercy Sunday reception of Holy Communion worthily and with trust in God's Mercy pours out upon the soul a complete renewal of baptismal grace." - Rev. Ignacy Rozycki, STD, Former Member of the Holy See's International Theological Commission

"My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet."

- Celebrate the Feast on Divine Mercy Sunday Repent of all sins and place complete trust in Jesus Go to Confession, preferably before that Sunday. Receive Holy Communion worthily on that day (or the Vigil celebration.)
 Venerate the Image of Divine Mercy
 Be merciful to others in deed, word, and prayer


