THE PASTOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION/ REFLEXIÓN SEMANAL DEL PÁRROCO

If you ever have the chance to go to the chapel of the Ascension in the Holy Land, that marks the spot where Our Lord was taken up bodily into heaven, it's a beautifully simple octagonal chapel with a simple dome. It once was ornately decorated inside. Now, it is empty but has a spot marked in the floor marble that appears to have "footprints." It's a wonderfully Catholic expression that gives credence to the fact that Our Lord has a Body that is Resurrected following His Death and Resurrection. Did he really leave footprints in marble? Was there marble in that spot in Palestine at the time He ascended to the right hand of the Father? All of that is part of the *tradition* of the Church. What is important is that his disciples saw Him ascend, and were then prompted to await the coming of the Holy Spirit.

How are we spending the next several days awaiting the outpouring of the Holy Spirit? Will it be just another liturgical event, where Mass vestments change? Will it be a week of *anticipation* of a greater release of gifts upon the church and upon each of us? What do you want from the Lord? Start praying now for how you want the Lord to interact with you. He promises another Advocate Who will draw us to the Heart of the Father. The Son reminds us that the Father wants to give good gifts to His children. What do you want?

Please be assured of my prayers this week.

Si alguna vez tienen la oportunidad de visitar la capilla de la Ascensión en Tierra Santa, que marca el lugar donde Nuestro Señor ascendió corporalmente al cielo, es una capilla octogonal hermosamente sencilla con una cúpula sencilla. Antiguamente estaba decorada con gran profusión. Ahora está vacía, pero tiene un punto marcado en el mármol del suelo que parece tener "huellas". Es una expresión maravillosamente católica que da crédito al hecho de que Nuestro Señor tiene un Cuerpo que Resucitó tras su Muerte y Resurrección. ¿Dejó realmente huellas en el mármol? ¿Había mármol en ese lugar de Palestina cuando ascendió a la diestra del Padre? Todo eso forma parte de la tradición de la Iglesia. Lo importante es que sus discípulos lo vieron ascender y fueron inspirados a esperar la venida del Espíritu Santo.

¿Cómo pasaremos los próximos días esperando la efusión del Espíritu Santo? ¿Será solo otro evento litúrgico, donde se cambian las vestimentas para la misa? ¿Será esta una semana de anticipación a una mayor liberación de dones sobre la iglesia y sobre cada uno de nosotros? ¿Qué deseas del Señor? Empieza a orar ahora para saber cómo deseas que el Señor interactúe contigo. Él promete otro Defensor que nos acercará al Corazón del Padre. El Hijo nos recuerda que el Padre desea dar buenas dádivas a sus hijos. ¿Qué deseas?




